“It really was the best decision I ever made and there are 'hidden' benefits that many do not see if they are not working at home. My children have grown up with a work ethic, great office skills, excellent telephone manner and other skills because of what they have seen and witnessed at home. They also got to earn money when helping me in the office once they were in their teens. All are now in their 20s but don't really remember a mum who was out at a job. And I truly believe my girls would have been different people if I'd not been here to help shape their lives - instead it would have been their peers or those they met out on the streets.

“Working from home isn't for everyone though, you need to enjoy your own company and not suffer easily from loneliness. You need to have initiative and self-discipline and be prepared to put in lots of hard work - you don't have someone else doing the promotions for you. But it can be achieved and is definitely worthwhile.”

Thomas is a home-based operator who set up business early 1994 and experienced the growth and development of her business over the Internet throughout those years. She spent 20+ years in the corporate world before returning back home to run a business whilst caring for her young family.
